


COLONEL BRETT M. BATICK

Col Brett M. Batick is the Commander of the 174th Attack Wing, New York Air National Guard, Hancock Field, Syracuse, New York. He is responsible for leading over 1,150 Airmen in MQ-9 combat operations that support multiple theatres of operation and provides muti-domain command and control to USAFE-AFAFRICA. Additionally, the Wing performs MQ-9 Test, Formal Training for MQ-9 Aircrew, MQ-9 Maintenance, including a Field Training Detachment, Range Operations, Mission Support and Medical Group functions. The 174th Attack Wing regularly answers deployment requirements around the globe and provides immediate domestic response capability as directed by the Governor of New York.

Col Batick graduated from the University of Florida in 1998 where he earned a Bachelor of Science degree in Electrical Engineering. Additionally, he earned a Master of Science in Environmental Engineering from Vanderbilt University in 2011. He previously served in the United States Marine Corps as an F/A-18 Pilot, 2-Plane and 4-Plane Flight Lead, and Airframes Maintenance Division Officer in Marine Fighter Attack Squadron 251, Beaufort, South Carolina. He went on to be an Advanced Jet Flight Instructor in Training Squadron 9 in Meridian, Mississippi.
